#### **Campbell River Estuary**

An easy 2 Km ramble along the banks of the River will highlight the importance of the habitat, historical impacts and community driven restoration projects. Lots of bird-watching potential so bring binoculars.

#### Fish Farm Management - 4.5 hours

Travel north through beautiful Discovery Passage to meet friendly staff who will share their knowledge of salmon care. Limited space.

#### Quinsam Hatchery

One of the earliest SEP facilities. After over 30 years of service it is getting a major overhaul; you will see both the old and new.

## Tyee Pool - 2 hours

A row in the famous Tyee pool by skilled oarsmen who fish it every year. Sit back and enjoy the silence. Learn about this century-old Campbell River tradition. Quadra Is. Enhancement Soc. - 3.5 hours Take the ferry to the eco center on Quadra Island. Tour the facility and drought proofing projects on Hyacinthe Creek. Have lunch at Heriot Bay before returning to Campbell River.

# Oyster River Hatchery - 3 hours

See the hatchery, spawning and rearing channels, fish ladders, and nature parks maintained year round by ORES. Includes Bear Creek and Oyster River Nature Parks; the Connolly, Arthur Mayse, Rippengale, Raven, #1 and #2 Side Channels; Woodhus Creek Fish Ladder.


